Fear comes in many different ways. There is a fear of snakes, a fear of heights, a fear of closeness, and the list can go on and on. Probably one of the greatest fears that we all possess is the fear of the unknown: i.e. the fear of going to the Doctor, the fear of what to do if ones loses their job, the fear of death. In each of these fears we struggle with the unknown and ask the question "what does the future hold."

Over the years humanity has created a number of different means to give them the illusion of knowing the future: Such means as Western Astrology, Chinese Astrology, Tarot Cards, Numerology, Palmistry and the list continues. We have the misconception that if we can know the future it will give us some control and will bring some peace.

In the book of Revelation, God responds to this fear of the unknown. He does it in a unique way. Instead of telling us what our future will hold. He tells us about the one who holds our future.

As Dr. Kinlaw writes in his book <u>Lectures in Old Testament Theology</u>, "when the book of Revelation talks about the future it does not tell you the what in your future, but it tells you the who" (p.203).

The Bible is very clear about our past, our present, and our future. In all three the promise is that we are in His hands. We are not left wondering on our own in the unknown but we are carried by the one who created it all.

Our future is unsure. We are not given the means to know what tomorrow will hold. But we are given a clear promise which is that He will hold us.

As in the song made famous during the Billy Graham's Crusades says,

Why should I feel discouraged? Why should the shadows come? Why my heart should feel lonely And long for heaven and home?

When Jesus is my portion. A constant friend is he. His eye is on the sparrow And I know He watches me.

For each member of our team to grow closer in our relationship with Jesus during the trip For safe travels to Mexico and back




