Wouldn't you like to know what Pilate's wife had dreamed? Pilate, the Roman ruler to whom the Jewish leaders brought Jesus to be crucified, was there at the judge's seat, and his wife sent him a message during Jesus' trial. The words of the message were, "Don't have anything to do with that innocent man, for I have suffered a great deal today in a dream because of him" (Matthew 27:19)

People trace the word pizza back to only 997 A.D.; it could not have been a pizza dream. But this brief sentence about Pilate's wife having a dream brings about many questions:

Why did she have this dream? Did it come from God?

Why did Pilate not have the dream or a vision?

What was the dream? What happened? What does it mean that she suffered

from the dream?

What kind of relationship did Pilate and his wife have? It must have been fairly good for him to be willing to get a message from her in the middle of a trial.

Of course, why didn't Pilate listen to his wife?

Did she know anything about Jesus?

There are many questions but few answers.

Let me make a couple observations from this one sentence of Scripture that we do know. (This is the only place this story is mentioned.)

First, the timing is impeccable. She apparently had that

dream that night, and she sent that message during the trial itself. How could the dream not be from God? It could not have been just coincidence. It is no accident that the events of Jesus' births included dreams and now his life is concluding with a dream. Over and over in Scripture God communicated by dreams.

God still speaks by dreams. In Acts 2, which is a quote of Joel 2, Peter states, "In the last days, God says, I will pour out my Spirit on all people. Your sons and daughters will prophesy, your young men will see visions, your old men will dream dreams." God's Spirit still communicates to us through dreams. Be alert!

Second, though we don't know what happened in the dream, she concludes that Jesus is an innocent man. As you step back and look at the bigger picture, a strange event is occurring. Pilate's wife has concluded through this dream that this man is innocent. Pilate can't find any crime that Jesus has done. In the words of Scripture, "When Pilate saw that he was getting nowhere, but that instead an uproar

> was starting, he took water and washed his hands in front of the crowd. 'I am innocent of this man's blood,' he said. 'It is your responsibility.''' (Matthew 27:24). Intriguingly, the two godless Romans (Gentiles) in this story could see that Jesus had done no crime, but the people who were to be

representing God to the world, the Jews, wanted him dead.

Beware of letting your religion blind you to who Jesus is. The people who should have known better, the Jews, the people with the Word of God, could not see God in Jesus living right in front of them. Our traditions, expectations, and man-made rules can hinder us from seeing Jesus Christ, the God man.

We do not know what was in that dream. One thing we do know, "God made him who had no sin to be sin for us, so that in him we might become the righteousness of God" (2 Corinthians 5:21).
