Isaac Newton grasped first the three laws of motion. The first law of motion, which we call the law of inertia, states that an object will continue at its state of rest unless it is acted upon by an outside force. It also tells us that if it already has a constant motion, it will continue at its constant speed unless otherwise acted upon by an outside force. Why am I bringing up science in a church newsletter? Has VBS played havoc with my mind? It may have, but that is not why I am talking about science.

We are looking for a movement of God at Air Hill. We have been studying the book of Acts since the end of May, and we have seen how the Holy Spirit moved among the apostles and disciples of the early church. We are seeking God's Spirit to move among us at Air Hill also. Notice, Air Hill is the object that is at rest or has a constant motion. The Holy Spirit is the outside force that creates the movement. When the Holy Spirit takes action and we fully yield to it, we have a movement of God.

Let me review some of the points we have learned thus far, so that we will know what a movement of God looks like:

- We must wait for the coming of the Holy Spirit. While we wait, we must pray together and choose godly leadership.
- We must receive the work of the Holy Spirit.
- When there is a movement of God, people will receive Jesus as Lord.
- When there is a movement of God, people will become devoted to the apostle's teaching, the fellowship, the breaking of bread, and the prayers.
- When there is a movement of God, people's lives will be transformed by faith in Jesus.
- When there is a movement of God, there will be opposition.
- When there is a movement of God, salvation will be found in no one else but Jesus Christ.
- When there is a movement of God, God confronts sin.
- When there is a movement of God, conflicts will be resolved.
- When there is a movement of God, people will be more and more engrossed with Jesus.

We have more to learn yet, as we continue to study the book of Acts. But let me give you and I a warning. Too often we look at others and think that they need a movement of God. They need to change. For us to experience a movement of God, we needs to begin with looking first and foremost at one's own self. Yes, I want you to pray for the whole congregation. Even more, pray to God, "Let it begin with me."

Isaac Newton happened to be a Christian. He not only taught us about the laws of motion scientifically, he taught us some truths spiritually. May God's Spirit move you closer and closer to Jesus Christ so that you may fulfill the purpose God the Father has for you.

Remember, you are loved by God. Take time to receive his love.

What a great evening of fellowship. The Lord blessed us with a beautiful evening.




