"Bah, humbug." Some might call me a Scrooge, but I am not really like Ebenezer. I just choose to celebrate the birth of Jesus Christ a little different than most.

I don't have a Christmas tree.

I don't have lights all over the house.

I don't have blow up figures all over the yard.

I don't spend hundreds or thousands of dollars for gifts, at least not in the conventional way. By no means have I ever gone in debt for Christmas.

I do look forward to the first and second coming of Jesus Christ through our family devotional with our advent wreath for the Advent season.

We do have a little décor in our house, highlighted by Nancy's hand carved wooden creche from England.

We do have a small gift exchange among the four of us.

We do connect usually with either Nancy's side or my side of the family for a meal; on Christmas morning we usually have a breakfast for the four of us.

Many years ago, when my first son was born, I began asking, "How should a follower of Jesus celebrate Christmas and teach their children about Christmas?" And since it was my job to train my sons in the ways of Jesus, I began wrestling with this issue. The commercialism of Christmas battles against celebrating Jesus; commercialism almost always counters following Christ, not just at Christmas. Many Christmas traditions are based on winter solstice celebrations and have nothing to do with honoring the incarnation.

At the heart of my thinking, if I can remember those earlier years rightly, are these two thoughts: We have a limited amount of time, so how are we going to use this time together?

We have a limited mind; we can only fill our minds with a certain number of things, so on what things am I going to encourage my sons to ponder?

Thus, I wanted to teach and train my sons as much as possible about the birth of Jesus and what his entrance into this world means. I wanted them to know Christmas was about Jesus and fill their minds with this truth. As they grew, they would tell me that Jesus is at the heart of Christmas. But right under the surface, they were also wondering what they would get. Yes, there was a battle for their minds. Yes, there will always be a battle, but now I no longer have the same responsibility for them as a parent.

I have observed a benefit from not joining the Christmas rush. Peace. Joy. I did have challenges to



that peace, such as working long hours delivering poinsettias to churches for Christmas. Yet, it was not a Christmas rush. It was where I was supposed to be, and where Jesus wanted me to be. Though the hours may have been full, and though I had to deal with a stressed-out boss, there was an underlying sense of peace. After all, where Christ is, there is peace.

In short, don't imitate others and get frazzled and rushed. Instead, go against the crowd and fill yourself with Jesus. With him there is joy and peace.

Dear friends,

It's been wonderful to connect with some of you as we travel throughout the East Coast. We will continue to be available to connect with people through November, December, and January; contact us if you wish to see us.

Last month our family celebrated 11 years of ministry among the Navajo People in the Four Corners. Because of our work, countless individuals have been ministered to through addiction recovery, meeting physical needs, and church planting.

One story of a changed life stands out. TJ is a Navajo man in his 50's who had struggled with alcohol but has now found a new life in Jesus. TJ was once bitter toward us. During that time Jason continued to keep the relationship door open on his end and prayed for TJ. One day TJ called Jason to inform us that he no longer held a grudge against us. He said, "My Navajo culture doesn't encourage forgiveness, but I'm choosing to forgive because that is what God wants me to do." We now have a very good friendship with TJ because he learned it is more important to obey Jesus than to follow his culture. Through our church planting efforts, our goal is to see life transformation like TJ's taking place throughout the Navajo Nation within the context of a local church body.

Our family doesn't do this alone. The work is a joint effort between us and our partners. When you give a financial gift, pray for us, send us an encouraging note, share our stories with others, and/or host us in your home; you partner with us.

When we return to the field in early 2020, we plan to focus more intently on developing a network of multiplying church plants through small group ministry. As we prepare to return to New Mexico in early 2020, we are looking for partnerships. We need partners of the past to renew their commitment for partnership. We also need new partners to join us. Would you please partner with us in these ways?

What are the 12 days of Christmas?

The 12 days of Christmas is the period that in Christian theology marks the span between the birth of Christ and the coming of the Magi, the three wise men. It begins on December 25 (Christmas) and runs through January 6 (the Epiphany, sometimes also called Three Kings' Day). The four weeks preceding Christmas are collectively known as Advent, which begins four Sundays before Christmas and ends on December 24.

- 2 Turtle Doves = The Old and New Testaments
- 3 French Hens = Faith, Hope and Charity, the Theological Virtues
- 4 Calling Birds = the Four Gospels and/or the Four Evangelists
- 5 Golden Rings = The first Five Books of the Old Testament, the "Pentateuch," which gives the history of man's fall from grace.
- 6 Geese A-laying = the six days of creation
- 7 Swans A-swimming = the seven gifts of the Holy Spirit, the seven sacraments
- 8 Maids A-milking = the eight beatitudes
- 9 Ladies Dancing = the nine Fruits of the Holy Spirit
- 10 Lords A-leaping = the ten commandments
- 11 Pipers Piping = the eleven faithful apostles
- 12 Drummers Drumming = the twelve points of doctrine in the Apostle's Creed

The partridge in the pear tree, naturally, represents Jesus Christ.
