Every Christmas season, battles occur. The season of peace erupts into wars. Maybe they will calm down now that people are buying more online. You can't fight for car spaces. You can't push and shove to get in line to enter the store at 4 a.m. You can't get in a fist fight over the only item left on the shelf. Weren't those days wonderful before online shopping?

Though there were time pressures around Christmas, especially with delivering poinsettias right up to Christmas Eve, I never really entered that battle like some did. I did have battles though:

Will Nancy and I agree on what we should buy for our sons?

Will our sons like or not like what they are getting?

How will my sons respond to our gift when their friends' gifts are so much more?

How can I raise my sons that Christmas is about Jesus when everyone else demonstrates that Christmas is about gifts?

How can I have time for Nancy and my sons at Christmas?

What should I buy for Nancy? Is there something special that I can get that is not on her list?

Early on, I battled this issue, "Does it make sense to make an almost 200-mile trip on Christmas to be with both our families? After a couple years, the answer was no.

Of course, I also had this internal struggle. My family did not have much gift giving when I was young, especially in comparison to Nancy's family. Thus, how was this going to work in our family? How was I going to respond when your in-laws give so much more to your sons than you?

Part of the battle of Christmas is not just physical, much of it is spiritual. This is involved in the above list, but it is not explicitly stated. From both Jesus' temptations in the wilderness (Matthew 4) and from 1 John 2:16, we see our own temptations:

Please your own bodily desires vs. following God's desires


Hunger for more power and authority over vs. submit to God's power

Force God to change situation with a miracle vs. trusting God in situation without a miracle We often put diets aside at Christmas. We might have good intentions not to eat as many cookies or chocolates or pies. We may have a thought about not stuffing oneself at the Christmas dinner, or dinners, as the case may be. But for most, all those intentions come to naught. We often fail. We lose the battle. We overeat. Of course, maybe that is why we purchase the exerciser for Christmas but then sell it by the end of January.

There are many battles at Christmas, almost all of them around the three listed above. However, the more you stuff yourself with Jesus, the Word, the more you will be able to know the grace and love of Jesus. The more you know his grace, the more you will have victory in your battles. The battles are not easy. Yet victory is possible for those who are not fainthearted. Of course, the battle is not only at Christmas; it is an everyday experience. The more we spiritually exercise, the more we will follow Jesus through the wind of the Holy Spirit and experience grace and victory in Jesus.
