# AIR HILL STATEMENT OF PURPOSE

"To Follow Jesus Christ through the Wind of the Holy Spirit"

As I was pondering what to write about in this newsletter, I pulled a book I had read many years ago off the bookshelf, "Experiencing the Spirit" by Henry and Melvin Blackaby. Here are some excerpts from the first chapter:

Looking back to the church in the first century, we're amazed at the impact of a people who appear to have had inadequate resources for such a monumental task. There were no seminaries to train their pastors, no beautiful church buildings in which to worship, and no such thing as a Bible in every member's hand. They had no elaborate sound systems or multimedia tools at their disposal, no celebrities to endorse their cause, and hardly any freedom to promote their belief in Jesus Christ. For the most part, they were plain men and women, insignificant and unknown, fighting against fierce opposition and hatred. But Scripture testifies that they "turned the world upside down" (Acts 17:6). Wave after wave of persecution broke over them, yet they emerged victorious. The message of the early church, as told in the book of Acts, is that the bare simplicity of the Christian faith is what counts. The testimony of early Christians was that God's people proclaimed the gospel in the power of the Holy Spirit and confirmed it with holy lives...

Does the world marvel at the church today? Unfortunately, much of what happens in the contemporary church is little more than a reflection of the values and the reasoning of the surrounding culture. When it comes to serving God, we tend to look at what we're good at and what we like to do, then serve according to our ability. The result: we don't need the Holy Spirit because we think we have everything under control. The world therefore sees good people doing good things for their God, but they don't see the power of God working through his people to accomplish what only He can do.

So, here's the question: will God ever ask you to do something you're not able to do? The answer is yes – all the time! It must be that way, for God's glory and kingdom. If we function according to our ability alone, we get the glory; if we function according to the power of the Spirit within us, God gets the glory. He wants to reveal Himself to a watching world.

In short, the contemporary church has become a man-centered church rather than a God-centered church. Of course, the Blackaby's also wrote a book about that also. The contemporary church sings more about "I" and how "I feel about God" than about God. These congregations barely read the Word together

nor do they pray together. Self-help sermons highlight the pulpit more than God-centered messages. Many of these congregations have people who will only agree to "serve" if they are comfortable doing it. They may do good things but not God things.

But we, at Air Hill, aim to be different. We aim to follow Jesus Christ through the wind of the Holy Spirit. We aim to glorify God in our music, in our prayers, in our services, and in our messages. We believe that if God's Spirit

calls us to some assignment, he will enable us to accomplish it through the power of the Holy Spirit, no matter if it makes us feel uncomfortable. Our fuel is God. Our motivation is God. Our goal is God. We believe and expect that when our community sees Air Hill, they see God-immersed people doing God-sized tasks for the glory of their God. As we continue our journey as the Air Hill family, may we daily offer ourselves as individuals and as a congregation to God so that God may be magnified across the valley. May we follow Jesus Christ by the wind of the Holy Spirit.




