If you are confused about our Designated Offerings, hopefully this will help. Listed here are some clarifications on our Designated Offerings.

*The 3rd Sunday of every month our designated offering is Common Ministries formerly known as Cooperative Ministries.

Through what is now Common Ministries, the Church, together, will continue sharing the gospel and serving unreached people around the world; stewarding our unique theology by honoring our legacy and preparing for the future; caring for pastoral leadership; partnering in church planting; connecting our congregations; and providing overall church leadership. Common Ministry of the Church would be Paying the Bishops, paying the Bic Director, Funding the operations of the Church Headquarter including secretaries etc.

Though each congregation ministers in its unique context, our Common Ministry goes beyond what can be accomplished individually. As congregations give 10 cents of every dollar they receive, together we fund ministry across the country and around the World. These funds, combined with donations, gifts, and bequests from individuals and organizations, allow the BIC U.S. to finance areas of shared ministry.

*The 5th Sundays are designated to BIC World Mis-

<u>sions</u>. The Brethren in Christ has missionaries all over the world. BIC World Missions desires to prioritize least-reached peoples.
