## AIR HILL STATEMENT OF PURPOSE

“To Follow Jesus Christ through the Wind of the Holy Spirit”

C.S. Lewis Institute just published in their “Broadcast Talks” a speech by James M. Houston, “And What About the Future?” This speech was originally made in 1971 and was prepared for the “Jerusalem Conference on Biblical Prophecy” in which 1300 evangelical Christians from 32 countries gathered in Jerusalem to proclaim their faith in the return of Jesus Christ and how it relates to the rebirth of the nation Israel. In this speech, James Houston talks about the end times. He declares his belief that the beast of the sea in Revelation 13 is not a nation or a king, but he believes the beast is technology and science. Can you believe that? Amazingly, he states this in 1971 when the Internet, email, smart phones, much less artificial intelligence have not yet been created. Maybe he is onto something.

However, this is what I want you to think about. He closes his speech with five things Christians should do based on the times and based on the John Donne’s question, “What if the present were the world’s last night?”:

He tells Christians to take the future more seriously. The secular sciences spend much time forecasting the future looking at trends and forecasts and developments. He believes Christians should also be studying this.

He believes Christians should “neither be daunted by the magnitude of global issues and problems, nor obsessed by them. Evil, we have noted, comes about through many small diverse, and often imperceptible movements and events.”

He believes Christians should be exploring the complexities of contemporary life; for example, there is a need for Christian economists.

He believes “we must witness against the use of violence and the advocacy of political revolution. Violence has become one of the most visible realities of national life today.”

This is his final point and what I want to highlight. “Finally, the Christian contemporary understanding of the judgment of nations must surely involve a radicalism of Christian discipleship that is disciplined, sacrificial and wholly committed to Jesus Christ. We can only be free from the tyrannies of our age, whether it be the love of money, the anxiety for status, or the desire for personal security by denying their overrated significance. The only way to win victories over these spiritual powers that oppress us is to give them up. Christ proved more powerful than all the principalities and powers arraigned against Him by surrendering Himself even unto death. If we believe in the reality of Christ’s love, we must go Christ’s way. We must reject worldly standards, carnal desires, and the human techniques of selfishness to live by faith alone, faith in the living God. This is brutal, it is heroic, it is against our own natures, but it is the only way of convincing our generation that God is our Ruler and Christ is our King.”

How then should we live if tonight is the world’s last night?

Some of our missionaries serve in sensitive areas so we cannot give their names and location over the pulpit but we can put them on our bulletin board. Thank you for praying.

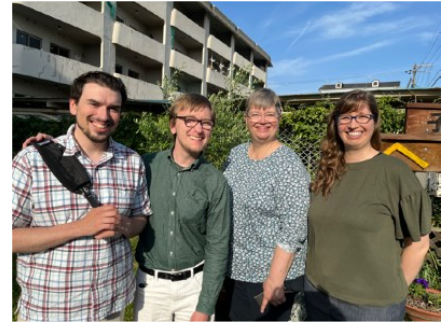
## From Karina Thrush in Japan
