Recently, I completed reading the book called <u>Learning Humility</u> by Richard Foster. He spent a year exploring humility. He follows the definition of humility as "seeing yourself as you really are." I lean toward the definition of "self-forgetfulness." We would both agree that humility is not thinking evil or bad of oneself as it used to be taught. Humility seems to center around loving God so fully and loving one's neighbor so well that one does not focus on oneself. Having said that, let me give you some thoughts from his book:


"I think one of the clearest signs of humility is a complete freedom from all domination and control. Humility has no desire and no need to force anything on anyone. Demanding is a posture foreign to a humble spirit. Humility possesses a friendly ease with others." (p. 27)

"I think that pride seems so strong because it orients all our desires and all our appetites around the self. The human self becomes the most central thing in our thinking and our living... When the vice of pride reigns supreme, we must be the center of everything. We must have. We must possess. We must win." (p.62-63)

"In holy leisure we are set free from the need to control, to push, to earn, to achieve. Holy leisure refers to a sense of balance in life, an ability to be at peace throughout the activities of the day, an ability to rest and take time to enjoy beauty, an ability to slow down and enter the cosmic patience of God...

Humility gives us the strength to turn from 'the frantic scramble of panting feverishness' we see all around us and instead quietly enter...holy leisure." (98-99)

Richard Foster quotes Thomas Kelly: "Humility does not rest, in final count, upon bafflement and discouragement and self -disgust at our shabby lives, a brow-beaten dog-slinking attitude. It rests upon the disclosure of the consummate wonder of God, upon finding that only God counts, that all our own self-originated intentions are works of straw. And so in lowly humility we must stick close to the Root." (p. 107)



That is with a good call. There is also the other kind that forces me to go through a full menu of options, none of which fit my needs...and never, ever allows me to actually talk to a human being. I

quickly learn that I utterly lack the patience it takes to work my way through our modern techno phone maze. Plus, I am frustrated by the abuse of people's time and energy this system produces.

Patience and humility. They are, I think, cousins in the pantheon of virtues. I have decided that my patience quota is low indeed." (p. 113)


Scripture Memory
