The Legend of George Washington's Baptism

Recently, as I was studying for the sermon on baptism, I came across an article called "The Legend of George Washington's Baptism." There seems to be no doubt that George Washington was baptized on April 5, 1732 as an infant within an Anglican church. However, along came a story that he was baptized as a believer in Jesus Christ.

According to the story, George Washington approached John Gano, a Baptist chaplain, with these words: "I have been investigating the Scripture, and I believe immersion to be baptism taught in the Word of God, and I demand it at your hands. I do not wish any parade made or the army called out, but simply a


quiet demonstration of the ordinance." This baptism allegedly occurred during the harsh winter of 1777/1778 at Valley Forge. George Washington was supposedly baptized in the icy waters of the Schuylkill River. Forty-two people witnessed this baptism as the story goes.

Intriguingly, it wasn't until 1870 that this claim was made by his grandchildren. They even signed affidavits. To top it off, in 1908 a pastor, E.T. Sanford, had a painting commissioned of this event, but strangely enough, the painting involved the Potomac River and not the Schuylkill River. That painting then has its own history which I will not tell here. "Time" magazine in 1932 published that quote of George Washington to John Gano to substantiate that story; they are the first ones to publish that request of George Washington to be baptized.

Now here is the problem according to some historians: 1) John Gano did not serve with General Washington but with General Clinton; 2) John Gano did not travel to Valley Forge that winter, nor did his memoirs record baptizing General Washington, a pretty significant event not to write about; 3) Plus, there are no written accounts from those forty-two witnesses of George Washington's baptism. Thus, this story falls under the same category as the myth of six-year-old George Washington cutting down the cherry tree. Did you know that was a legend also?

It seems that life has not changed. Technology has changed. Stories travel faster. People love to make up stories. They love to make heroes out of people. Some even want to make them Christian heroes. Of course, it works the opposite way also, does it not? People are torn apart as villains in the media. How are you going to determine what is true and what is false?

Intriguingly, two thousand years ago, the same problem existed. Jesus is standing before Pilate, and Pilate asks Jesus, "What is truth?" Pilate probably had heard so much garbage; he may have shoveled some of his own. He was a politician. He was the governor. Thus, he couldn't believe anybody. Yet, here is Jesus Christ standing before him who says, "You say that I am a king. In fact, the reason I was born and came into the world is to testify to the truth. Everyone on the side of truth listens to me" (John



18:37). Amazingly, Pilate believed Jesus. He knew Jesus did no wrong. Yet, because of "politics," he handed Jesus over to be crucified.

How do we treat the good news of Jesus? I believe the life of Jesus Christ is not at all like the legend of George Washington. In fact, you can find people who explored Jesus' life thinking it was a legend but discovering the veracity of the Bible and Jesus Christ, people like Josh McDowell and Lee Strobel. These atheists were transformed by their research, and then they wrote about what they learned. We may base our life on the gospel of Jesus; there is nothing better. In fact, Jesus invites us to make his story our story, and as we do, his story transforms us.

#### September Spiritual Exercise:

- Break each part of the "Lord's prayer" into their separate phrases; e.g.. "Our Father in heaven," "hallowed be your name."
- Pray, meditate, or sing through each of those phrases one at a time. In other words, spend time praising God for being our Father.
- Ponder what that means that we may communicate with the creator of the universe who at the same time tells us we may address him as Father. Maybe even a song comes to mind, such as, "He's a good, good Father." After you have completed one phrase, move on to the next phrase.
- Try to pray through the Lord's prayer this way twice in the month of September. It might be a great way to prepare yourself for Sunday worship on a Saturday night or a Sunday morning.

Our Father in heaven, hallowed be your name, your kingdom come, your will be done, on earth as it is in heaven. Give us today our daily needs. Forgive us our sins as we forgive those who sin against us. Lead us not into temptation but deliver us from the evil one. Amen.

Task 2) In Malawi: to organize video recording of 42 Bible lessons for pastors in Mozambique, which can also be used in Malawi. It will be a team effort as church leaders that will do the teaching, as well as students, will be from both countries. A plan for distribution of the videos will be established.

In addition to task #2 above, Orville will discuss with Malawi and Mozambique church leaders of possible ways that Zambia and Zimbabwe might help them with biblical and leadership training.

In addition to task #1 above, Orville will lead a few days of biblical training seminars.

October 20 - Bus from Zimbabwe to Chroma, Zambia

November 19 - Fly from Lusaka, Zambia to USA
