The Gospel



in a Nutshell

The Gospel in a Nutshell

What is life about?
Family? Friends? Parties? Cars? Food?
Sports? Fashion?
What is your life about?
Jesus described eternal life as this:
"Now this is eternal life, that they may know you, the only true God and Jesus Christ whom you have sent" (John 17:3).

Eternal life = (is) knowing God and Jesus Christ.

Eternal life is about knowing God, not just knowing about God, but knowing him intimately as a husband knows his wife and a wife knows her husband. We may know God personally and relationally now and through eternity.

Jesus did go on to say, "I have brought you (God) glory on earth by completing the work you gave me to do" (John 17:4). As Jesus was given a purpose and work to do, so God has a purpose for us to fulfill. This is part of eternal life: knowing God personally and achieving his purposes.

But what hinders us from experiencing life? "I!" From birth we have defined life as "I". Whatever pleases "I," we pursue. We have put "I" on the throne of our heart. We worship and serve "I." We expect everyone and everything to serve "I." Every attempt to please "I" we call sin. The heart of sin is "I": self-interest, self-centeredness, self-absorption, and self-reliance.

Some of the results of sin include:

<u>Separation from God:</u> "But your iniquities have separated you from God; your sins have hidden his face from you, so that he will not hear" (Isaiah 59:2)

Addiction: "I tell you the truth, everyone who sins is a slave to sin" (John 8:34).

<u>Death:</u> "For the wages of sin (self-interest) is death, but the gift of God is eternal life through Jesus Christ our Lord" (Romans 6:23).

So, how do we begin to experience eternal life, a life that never ends?

First, we must <u>admit</u> that we are living for ourselves. We need to confess to God that we have had "I" on the throne of our heart.

Second, we need to <u>turn</u> to God for help. We turn to God for help, because he is the one who created us, and he created us with a purpose. We need to tell God in prayer, "I am living for myself and I am making a mess of the life you have given me."

Third, we need to **receive** by faith what God has already accomplished for us in Jesus Christ. Jesus was fully God and fully man, and he came to rescue us from the bondage of sin, "the slavery to pleasing 'I." Through his life, he showed us how to live for God and not for oneself. He showed us this through his actions and through his teachings. Through his death, he paid the penalty of our sin (self-interest). Though we earned spiritual and physical death as our wages, he died in our place. Through his resurrection, he has given us power over our sin (self-centeredness). We can have the ability to say "No! to pleasing oneself, and we can live to please God. Thus, as we learn who Jesus is and what he has done for us, we pray to God, "Thank you for all that Jesus has done for me. Thank you for sending Jesus to pay the wages of my sin. Help me live as Jesus lived.

Help me learn to follow him in everything I do. Help me know you more."

What is life about? Jesus Christ. We live by confidence and faith in him, for "for he is the way and the truth and the life. No one comes to the Father except through him" (John 14:6). When we put Jesus on the throne of our heart, and let him rule our lives, then we begin to experience what life is about, eternal life, that never ends. As we begin to pray, to read and meditate on the Bible, and to meet with other followers of Jesus, our relationship with God grows deeper and we will more fully understand his purposes for us. As we do, we will have "life to the full" (John 10:10).

- Meditate on Colossians 3:17 NIV "And whatever you do, whether in word or deed, do it all in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God the Father through him."
- This month try to do everything in honor of God "in the name of the Lord Jesus." Drive your car, answer the telephone, conduct a staff meeting, walk your dog, milk your cows, mow your yard, greet people, or google on your computer to an audience of One the triune God.
- Carry in your pocket the words "in the name of Jesus" to help remind you to do so.

The challenge: This year read and meditate through the gospels. Begin each day (you may choose another time) and for at least 15 minutes read and ponder the gospel reading for the day. Before you begin each reading, ask God to help you know Jesus more. For added benefit to your life, write down every insight you gain from that time or from your thoughts about the gospel as you think of it throughout the day.

Each month I will give you the next month's readings. (It will take three months to go through each gospel.) Note: I will give you 25 readings for a month. If you miss a day, you may catch up another day.
